Hebrew University Emergency Aid for Researchers and Students from Ukraine: Ukrainian academic faculty members, residents of the Ukraine, who serve in academic institutions in the Ukraine, are invited to continue their research activity within the framework of the Hebrew University (HUJI). The invitation includes staying at the University for a period of up to four months, during which the University will provide scholarships for suitable guests worth up \$2,500/month for individuals and \$2,800/month for families, as well as free accommodation in the University's dormitories for a four-month period.
